Indicate Your Native Tree Choice(s) - all trees below are low water users native to the Tucson basin:

Velvet Mesquite (*fast/moderate growth rate to 20' + tall & wide, semi-winter deciduous, yellow flowers, nitrogen-fixer*)

Blue Palo Verde (*fast/moderate growth rate to 20+' tall and wide, blue-green leaves and bark, yellow flowers*)

Foothills Palo Verde (*moderate growth rate to 20' tall and wide, yellow-green leaves and bark, yellow flowers*)

Desert Willow (*fast growth rate to 20' tall and wide, winter deciduous, no thorns, purple/white flowers*)

Cat Claw Acacia (*moderate growth rate to 20' tall and wide, winter deciduous, grey bark, yellow flowers, nitrogen-fixer*)

White Thorn Acacia (*moderate growth rate to 15" tall and wide, winter deciduous, red bark, yellow flowers, nitrogen-fixer*)

Desert Ironwood (*moderate growth rate to 20' tall and wide, evergreen, plant in warm microclimate, purple flowers, nitrogen-fixer*)

STREET TREES COST \$6 EACH – MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO “TREES FOR TUCSON”

Number of trees available per address are limited by how many trees will reasonably fit with a
minimum spacing of 20 feet between each tree, proper set backs from utilities, and maintaining
pedestrian accessways. All street trees must be planted in the public right-of-way.

NOTE: Before you plant, call Blue Stake 1-800-782-5348 to mark all underground utilities for free. Plant trees at least 10 ft. from sewer
lines, 5 ft. from water lines, and 3 ft. from all other utilities. Do not plant under any overhead utility lines.

Do not plant in the public right-of-way without a permit and Blue Stake clearance.

Plant trees at least 20 ft. from one another.
